Lula - its overcrowding in the home. My son is disable and have applied with nha but nothing.

Lola - there is funding from arpa and we need to home assessment. Whose name is on the homesite lease

Lula - its under my name and son. What about my son and he prepared all his documents.

Lola – does he have homesite lease

Lula - yes he does. He came back and is disable.

4. Page Unified School - Mr. Anderson

Des - introduce herself to the community. Superintenedent Bryce Anderson is traveling and maybe present during chapter meeting. Concern with absent at the schools. Please verify absent for sickness or appts. Have parents read to their child 15 minutes and if student can read then have child read to the parent to increase reading score. PUSC govt board approved for indigenous day. Carlos will cover parent teacher conference. Ask chapter officials participate in the school meeting.

Stanford - road 6210 from porcupine to red mesa is rough and its unsafe for the bus. Its 2-3 miles that is really bad. They tried to grade it but its too sandy. Either county need to do it. its my concern. Put some gravel on it or take sand out.

Des - impact aid in Washington dc with staff and students. Owen was one to represent coppermine. There was student from each chapter to represent. We gave the floor to the students. Road condition is most roads are dirt road. Its goal to get Tom O'Halloran to come visit the bus route.

Stanford - made resolution to NDOT then they give it back to BIA then back to NDOT. Henry begay is the contact person. Garrett Silversmith is another person to contact. Need to have workorder which I had submitted for the roads.

Des - in reality it's the stakeholders responsibility. Its time to schedule a chapter forum for this. It's the Indian Education should be here to communicate with the chapter. I would like to

schedule a chapter forum.

Lola – last report we heard from PUSD was Lynol Tso. We need to get report on the impact report and 80% are Navajos. What is the school offering our children.

Des - I will share that with superintendent. In the past, the information was shared.

Mr Begay - American Indian Education Programs brochure. Working for the Johnson O'Malley. Population is 1765 students, coppermine has 109 students. Other is 98. Unknown 609. Talking about impact aid that parent need to claim where is impact like chapters and its how school gets funding. Even though you live in coppermine but you claim po box in page or street address in page but make sure coppermine is counted for. Parent teach conference is coming up next week. Ask for donation for parade at western Navajo Fair Parade for candies. Oct 26 at 530pm at CAB for the Page Indian Pageant. Day of celebration is November 15. Gave information board on the dine philosophy of education.

Lula - on my grandchildren we used po box so how do put it right now

Mr begay - on the application there is place to indicate the chapter and it lists all the chapters

Stanford - with rural addressing come that should help

Lola - for Road N21 there are many school that use the road like page, kaibeto, tuba city, gap, boarding school, etc so we need resolution to pave the road. With the clinic coming we need to get road paved and more homes coming. We need the impact aid utilized for the roads instead of using the impact aid at the border town.

Des - we need round table discussion,

Lola – need junior high near the clinic, it will be new community that will be going up

Allen - meeting with the chapter officials would be great

Des - biggest feedback from IEC that its at the agenda is most attendees are the grandparents, be good to have meeting at school to get feedback from parents, mr begay can do meeting at chapter meeting

- 5. Indian Education Committee- Fern Bigman-Green / JOM Coordinatior- Mr. C. Begay NOT PRESENT
- 6. Traci Parker, Principal for Tse'Yaato'High School introduced herself and location of high school. We are Coconino accommodation school. If student are not successful in public high school then they can attend Tse'Yaato'High School. 85% native American, 8% Hispanic, 2%mix, etc and only 50 students at the school. We don't collect taxes. Only resource is grants we apply for. When covid hit a lot of students didn't attend school and are behind in school and are behind 1 year. We are pressing hard for students to catch up. State test has changed 5 times. AIMS testing all our students passed. Teenage parent - student bring their babies to school so they continue their education and set of wing is set teen parent. We had this program for 7 years and have graduated 60 teen parents. We have 3 students in the teen parent continue education. Encourage the teen parent not in school to come to our school. We do on-job training credit. OHSA 10 training. We have financial algebra class, personal finance, we assist with FAFAS, gardening, native plants in gardening, last spring we went through 5 year accreditations and we have scored the highest level, oct 19 is celebration for the high marks for the accreditations, identified as a school of distinction.

Allen - what school courses are offered, is it the same at the public school

Traci - we concentrate on general studies and no class for student government, etc.

Allen - any trades

Traci - small staff so no trades. SET are funded through JPED at the high school and not for our school.

Allen – can you do dual enrollment

Traci - yes we can

Des – as parent, my child struggle with virtual learning and needed to be in-person education
