Delores – people have moved from fbfa, no road pavement, introduce self to the community Rita Bilagody – introduce self to the community, this resolution presented today is to have sacred site designation to stop development, there are still people going to the confluence for development, have hydrogen pipeline going through Navajo Nation, this is going to phoenix and not Navajo nation, our medicine people go down there, other tribes go there and its sacred area, asking for your help and have legislation to go the council,

Floyd – biological, diversity, introduced self to the community, the resolution number have changes, delores and her group have travel to many chapters, they have done petition as well, bodaway gap stating resolution, why is it sacred, how is it sacred, it doesn't really state in the resolution, the resolution was also to oppose pump storage project, the big canyon gorge, we have received the same proposal, we need to refine the resolution since its coming from the chapter, the previous resolution was coming from bodaway gap chapter and just change the chapter name, the little Colorado river gorge, the salt canyon trail which used by hopi / Navajos / other tribe use the salt and other sacred stones, there are archaeological ruins, the US forest service, welcome center, escalade

was defeated, hydrogen electric pump storage is another project coming, bruce spring, turquoise color spring, 13 mile from the confluence, tourist hike down the confluence, pump storage needs 2 heights, 50 acre pond with depth on top then 2 - 24 inch pipe going down to the pond at the bottom, 660 acre is needed for the pump storage so its big area, high evaluation, no resident in the area, there are 8-9 families that utilize the land for their livestock, everytime it rains then its used by the animals, there is area for endangered and threaten species the red zone (pointing on the map). Floyd – provide assistance to delores and revised the resolution which was a lot of work, registered historical place, the resolution read:

- Coppermine chapter recognized the confluence,
- Groundwater

Groundwater have to drill xx feet. We are in bowl. There is 1000 feet difference. The weight of water and distance of water turn those turbine. There will be 2 pumping station, there is no windmill north, this maybe the last water resource we have. The resolution in the past was defeated so that resolution is dead. Another resolution was brought into the chapter which had resolution number CO-10-003-24.

Sara – a lot of the departments for arpa funds so there is proposal by leadership to obtain funds that will not meet the deadline will be used for other projects, ive attended leadership meeting last Friday, chapter projects if chapter can't make it then can move the funds to save haven to keep the funds, people say that they aren't receiving assistance from the chapter, there are NPL funds, there is press release from president that 50 years ago, is there way to raise \$1M for the past 50 years so resolution for \$50M, there are 23 chapters, maybe identify 2-3 families per chapter, nation have lawsuit, these are people that need basic home repair.

Sara – introduced herself to the community. Director for the NHLO. Impacted 9 chapters for FBFA. Funds for home repairs. October 1, 2023 – president buu appointed me director, people came to me of their home situation, I looked at the budget, only budget of \$400,000, I come from hospital and have budget for personnel that is \$400K, trauma going into 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> generation, serve the most disadvantage,

Debra – the 1<sup>st</sup> generation can pass to the 2<sup>nd</sup> generation, some homes were condemn, there is no running water, Navajo Thaw is asking congress for \$4 billion, chapter need to download their document from Navajo Thaw, for \$16million is due able, Brian Cole has no approval to ask for funds for FBFA, Navajo Thaw did the job and should not be asking for funds, and Navajo nation should be asking for funds,

Floyd – brian cole is in cowho with rid development, he just wants funds.

Sara – no hydrogen storage, who to send the document

Floyd – natural resources

Sara – there are 9 hydrogen drilling, legal surface rights,

Sara – value of uranium is going up daily so more outside companies coming in

Sara – we do have moratorium but not where they will be transporting it
