April 7 – chris came to joe littleman house to apologize and can use the road but there were sand pile created on the road. I take care of my dad at his house and we ran out of woods, road the connects 6210 which look like sand pile were created, Arizona long term care, building ditches and creating sand pile on the roads is not good, I never brought it to anyone attention until now, I want it to stop now, why is this taking place, what have I done, my children will come out on weekend to check on their

grandpa, when we were getting fire wood, mistakenly took wrong turn and came upon sand pile and ditches, I greet your family and care for the family, need road maintenance so roads are accessible for homecare workers, I am submitting my written statement.

Chris – the statement is toward me, ntua worked on the road, Alicia Richards, I did apologize, Floyd – point of order – agenda it was add-on, what is brought out, peacemaking court is where this shall go, refer this case to peacemaking, the road that was dug out was not me, person committed suicide,

Resolution # CO-05-038-24: Supporting and Recommending the Resource and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council to approve and to support the planning efforts of Navajo Division of Transportation (NDOT) and Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Roads to conduct a traffic study to assess improvements at the intersection of N20 and Navajo Route 6226 to ensure community members can safely access the Coppermine Chapter House without any risks or danger posed by high-speed traffic or other factors.

Lola – I worked hard on this resolution. The junction of N20 and chapter road and motorist are speeding and is a danger, plus chapter road there is curve road which is hard to see and request for traffic study

Betty – chris and I reside out there and would like to get few more extra road, families have to use road to get ot the bus stop, I am for the school children, give us bus route; 6210 bus route is use daily at 3pm, after school, activity bus so busses are running 4 runs; statement for our children to get to school; route and improvement we want,

Chris – we live out there everyday and not in town,

Stanford – road was made but road is sandy, elders get stuck in the road, there is road dispute, ron water resource said they can drill for water but need road access, they use dully to haul water, why do you say that, why are there gate and elders get stuck, we need to work together, back in the days our elders use Ke and we have lost the Ke ways, 5 families are disputing, I know the roads, caretaker say I don't want to go out there due to road access, water haulers do their own maintenance due to love of their animals,

Floyd – Navajo water rights, group came to chapter, negotiate the water settlement, there are 2 ways for ligation through court system or settlement, court system is slow so recommend to go with settlement, resolution was given to chapter's that are impacted, Valerie gave me the resolution, I overview the resolution, this is fuzzy resolution, its not written by appointed by person writing resolutions, there are unclear sentences and structures and sentences, I started to review the resolution, then another resolution showed up that is better, at planning meeting discussed that here are missing words, Navajo water rights discussion, impact Coppermine wasn't included, we are pretty much left out with the state (UT, NM, AZ), the little Colorado we were left out, we want to be treated fairly to water rights, there is no clause on fairness or equity, during planning meeting to include fairness and equity and I put in there a sentence on Navajo water commission that provide information which is for community awareness Chris – we are talking about water rights for our children, in 1932 land withdrawal, Floyd – water rights, they reserve, there are confidential information that wasn't share with us, the main parts will be used, future generation is address in here which is address for the future home land,

Monday meetings isn't good for her, she will be attending graduation for the remainder of the month in kaibeto/page/Shonto/phoenix/ Richfield/etc, the resolution she wanted passess was on the agenda and it was passed, there are no resolutions in window rock on the pavement of the road, water line extension, need to update the listing, arpa funds, delegate region, working with JSRA with non-certified chapters, the \$8 million for 5 chapters, \$16,300 wasn't used, at the end of the arpa season is over then it will be reallocated, we discussed on how to use the funds and will use the funds for PPE, i have got paperwork for PPE then plans changed again to use the funds for septic tank cleaning, names were given, arpa funds will go back into pot, what do we do out here for the chapter so said to do multipurpose building for gap/Coppermine/lechee/kabieto, package was moved forward, I email since I didn't hear anything, found out it was emailed to chapter of missing document, so handle the document, summer session is coming, recognition during summer session, sand tan charter, the 15 miles, only 3 chapters came to meeting, gap/Shonto/xxx didn't come, Navajo transit and maybe have one from black mesa to page and tuba city to page so need chapter resolution to have Navajo transit come out,

Comment – agree to have transit to flagstaff

Comment – people throw off their dogs and come to our homes, we have 3 or 4 females and get a lot of pups, we have people complainers, to take dogs to tuba city to drive 45 min, need to work on this, our dogs attacking sheep and cows,

Tom – need to call window rock, its nationwide problem, dog catchers,

Bessie – I have called and no answer, who do we contact for septic tank cleaning,

Tom – do you budget for septic tank cleaning, maybe your sales tax,

Valerie – dig deep

Chris – introduce, running for chapter president, we don't live near window rock, there is a lot of housing, people move to flagstaff/phoenix, arpa money is from pandemic, we got effected, help with the resources, funds go to window rock,

Allen – can do chapter resolution for budget transfer, get 3 price quotes for the septic cleaning

Comment – need to open for veterinarian due to animal issue, I see elders hauling water in their old vehicle, why can't chapter get big water truck and haul water to elders, we don't have water running,

Tom – the Navajo nation sales tax could have been used to budget for septic tank and purchase water truck,

Allen – wage is low for Navajo nation, we had meeting with law enforcement, sergeant from tuba city just 1 person, county had 8 police officers, sergeant said nobody applies for the tuba city police position, we need plan,
