- 5. TCRHCC- Radiation Department: Natasha Begay: In the Radiation Department of Tuba City Regional Health Care Cooperation, we provide Radiation Exposure Screening and Education Program through a grant. Individuals affected by the downwind and lived near uranium sites like in Bittersprings and Rare Metals are able to be screened at the Radiation Exposure Screening Clinic. Doctors are very compassionate about what they do and their clients. The Radiation Exposure Compensation Act is available for all eligible individuals that have been exposed 7/51 7/62 with proven medical documentation. Applicants have a deadline of July 9,'22 to submit application.

## III. Chapter Administration and Chapter Officials Report:

- 1. Council Delegate- Honorable Paul Begay: A reminder about the upcoming election, even though there's only one candidate, we all need to vote because it reflects on the amount of funding for the chapter, based on the total number of voters. This morning, I had a NABI meeting, and as of now in special session. One item for discussion is Gaming Compact to make an agreement with the State of Arizona. It involves being able to make bets involving the professional sports. Four members of the Health, Education and Human Services Committee Members are in Washington D.C. this week meeting with various members of congress. This Saturday is the Western Agency Council meeting.
- 2. Chapter President- Allen Fowler: We had a meeting with NDOT yesterday and today. Much information was shared with us about NDOT and BIA roads. Roads are bladed quarterly and NDOT can clear snow on N20 which is a BIA road. To qualify in the Chapter's 15 miles Regional Routes for blading, we were asked if the route was a bus route, the number of daily traffic counts, and total number of elders that live on that particular route. These all go into account to qualify a route for quarterly blading. Question L. Tsosie? When is NR21 up for paving from First windmill to Kaibeto? Honor Paul Begay: We met about a month ago about this road in Flagstaff. There is an MOA agreement between the Nation, Coconino County and BIA for road improvement. We met with President Nez, Silversmith, Lena Fowler and City of Flagstaff to improve this road. The justification is the upcoming clinic, a lot of residence, school bus routes, bus maintenance cost, economic development, and tourist. Most funds have gone to other areas, Western Navajo has been left out.
- 3. Chapter Vice-President- Lola Smith: We passed N21 Resolution C0-01-013 back in January. We hand-carried the resolution to the NDOT meeting and found out we missed the due date by one day. The

resolution is in the hands of NDOT now. Hopefully, we will have a paved road within 5 years or less. April 2<sup>nd</sup>, we will have a housing assessment training to secure the Escrow Fund through Nava-Hopi Land Commission. Choice Humanitarian will provide the training using KOBO Toolbox app. We need all the volunteers we can get for the FBFA, the southern part of Coppermine.

- S. Whitehat: Thank you for your discussion on N21. This is a bus route and its not good for the busses. It takes a long time to travel this rough road when going to the hospital. Thank you for this.

- 5. Chapter Grazing Official- Stanford Fowler: Through NDOT presentation, we found out with needed Work orders on NR 20, that goes to BIA. Only snow removal would be done by NDOT. These are the proper channel. AIF update: The resolution will be acted on at the regular chapter meeting with all proper paperwork. All those permittees that had tally counts are on the list to receive hay.
- 6. CLUPC President- Linda Long: CLUPC Officials and Chapter Officials, we need to meet together to update land withdrawals to have shovel-ready projects. No update on our CLUP Manual.
