3. Navajo Tribal Council Resolution CJ-21-21-53 established the Navajo Higher Education Scholarship Fund and provide for its administration through the Advisory Committee of the Navajo Tribal Council Resolution ACA-65-53 which adopted the rules and regulations for the operation of the funds; and
4. The Coppermine Chapter has established so that each student requesting chapter scholarship financial assistance will be given in the amount of \$500.00 for the Chapter Scholarship Fund for financial assistance; and
5. Each student will be required to fill out the Chapter Scholarship Application and follow its guidelines and stipulation which requires students to turn in their official final grades before a check is issued out; and





RESOLUTION OF THE COPPERMINE CHAPTER OF THE NAVAJO NATION

REAFFIRMING AND SUPPORTING THE INTER-GOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN COCONINO COUNTY, BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS AND THE NAVAJO NATION IN JOINT PARTNERSHIP AND OBLIGATIONS FOR ROAD IMPROVEMENT, MAINTENANCE, AND CONSTRUCTION AND REQUESTING UPMOST CONSIDERATION OF SAID ENTITIES FOR PRIORITIZATION AND FUNDING UNDER THE FEDERAL TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN AND PRESIDENT BIDEN'S \$1.2T INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT AND JOBS ACT (NOV. 2021) FOR IMPROVEMENT, MAINTENANCE, AND CONSTRUCTION OF NAVAJO ROUTE 21 WITHIN COPPERMINE CHAPTER.

WHEREAS:

1. Coppermine Chapter is a duly-recognized and certified chapter of the Navajo Nation government pursuant to 26 N.N.C. Section 3; 11 N.N.C., Part I Section 10; and
2. Pursuant to Title 26, N.N.C., Section 1 (B), The Coppermine Chapter is vested with governmental authority to review all matters affecting the community; to take appropriate action when necessary; and to make recommendations to the Navajo Nation and other governmental agencies; and
3. A intergovernmental agreement exists between Coconino County, Bureau of Indian Affairs, and the Navajo Nation for joint partnership and obligations for road maintenance and improvement on systems roads located within Coppermine Chapter; and
4. Pursuant to Coppermine Resolutions CO-07-034-17 and CO-04-050-21, the chapter has identified and prioritized Navajo Route 21 for improvement and paving under the federal and tribal transportation long-range plan; and
5. The Coppermine Chapter recognizes the severe need for improvement, maintenance, and construction of N21 for the residents of The Former Bennett Area for convenient travel, health and welfare appointments, employment, and the safe transportation of students of the area; and
6. The Coppermine joins Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation and local chapters Gap/Bodaway and Kaibeto to advocate for prioritizations and funding needs; and
7. A state of emergency exists on the Navajo Nation due to the Covid-19 pandemic since March 2020 and it has resurged. Therefore, it is a great necessity for road improvement for emergency vehicles, and medical transportation to speedily transport clients to medical centers.
8. The Coppermine Chapter request for consideration for the Federal Transportation Infrastructure Funds and the President Biden's \$1.2 T Infrastructure and Jobs Act (Nov.2021) to improve the transportation system in Coppermine Chapter.


NOW, THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED THAT:

The Coppermine Chapter recognizes the severe need for improvement, maintenance, and construction of NR6210 for the residents that resides in the Western Area of Coppermine Chapter Highway 89 for convenient travel, health and welfare appointments, employment, and the safe transportation of students of the area; and
6. A state of emergency exists on the Navajo Nation due to the Covid-19 pandemic in March 2020 and it has since resurged. Therefore, it is a great necessity for road improvement for emergency vehicles, and medical transportation to speedily transport clients to medical centers.
7. The Coppermine Chapter request for consideration for the Federal Transportation Infrastructure Funds and the President Biden's \$1.2 T Infrastructure and Jobs Act (Nov.2021) to improve the transportation system in Coppermine Chapter.




