Square water barrels = gap \$7, tonalea \$8, ntua \$3, page \$1.75 Trash fee increase for half truck load \$5; full truck load \$10. Verification of residency. Window Rock states chapter can not write residency of verification and wants to be more restrict on verification. Other chapter charge \$5 like inscription house; gap and lechee and tuba city stop residency verification. Increase facility usage. Some people don't clean after using facility usage. Lechee is \$35; other chapter \$50 and tuba city is \$200 for facility usage. For resident is \$200 and non-resident is double. Increase facility usage to \$50 with security deposit \$25.

Is there computer to be issues then it should be given to western instead of bidding. We are going to get first choice. We made Navajo nation survive. I am meeting with JT willie and will let him know that. Valerie – is the FBFA \$100,000 Escrow Budget Resolution was given to Navajo Hopi Land Commission members and Robert Black on July 30, 2019 and nothing was been done about it and stated by window rock that they didn't received any resolution so chapter sent copies to NHLC. I

Paul - i'll have angie get an update on it. I haven't seen the legislation.

Sid – get woods for elders.

Paul – Navajo Parks Recreation have funds so going to take \$1million to fund Waterline Project. Last year fair was short fund and funds were approved. The new council request for figures budget.

Paul – kaibab forest was agreed for Navajo to take forest. Flea market 2 or 3 rd week to get woods. Can get 30 cords in one season. Cost is \$2.50. agreement ceremonial woods too.
