The lumberjack might be judge or police and they will tell you are impersonating law.

During the Fish and Wildlife and Navajo Forestry's presentation I put the Budget for the Unhealthy Food Tax and NN Sales Tax on the Board for the Community. Chapter Staff brought the checks for my approval signatures.

Tour Guide Business donated \$1500 for the powerline assistance which brought the cost down for Etta Black. Coppermine Chapter have submitted for Powerline Project to CDBG.
