Hailee is an undergraduate student in the Department of Anthropology and Native American Studies at Dartmouth College who received approval for her Mellon Mays Undergraduate Fellowship research entitled, "Indigenous Duality in Dinetah- A Closer Look at Navajo People's Interactions & Experiences with the Coal Mining Industry," which will be completed for fellowship as well as graduation requirements;
- 4. Hailee Brown requests a resolution of support from the local agency council of the Coppermine Chapter to meet the requirements of the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department (NNHPD) and Dartmouth College Institutional Review Board (IRB):
- 5. Hailee Brown's senior capstone project analyzes the memories and experiences of Navajos who have interacted in any capacity with the coal mining industry, specifically the Navajo Generating Statin (NGS), which she will complete by June 2020;
- Hailee Brown's applies the methodological approach of ethnohistory, indigenous decolonizing research methods, and principles of Navajo storytelling to further understand Navajo people's relationship with the coal mining industry and NGA;
- Hailee Brown's senior capstone project focuses on documenting experiences of Navajo people who work/previously worked in the coal
 mining industry, work/worked at NGS, have family members who work/worked in either sectors, or who live/lived near either sector;
- 8. Hailee Brown plans to interview at about ten Navajo people, from Coppermine and nearby areas concerning their experiences with the coal mining industry and NGS;
- 9. by the fall of 2019, Hailee will complete the research and interviews, preparing and writing drafts of the senior capstone project chapters;
- during the upcoming academic year of 2019-2020, Hailee will write and complete the chapters of her Mellon Mays Undergraduate Fellowship senior capstone project;
- 11. Hailee Brown in September 2020 will present her research to the people of Coppermine during a regularly scheduled Chapter Meeting;

WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3 (A), the Coppermine Chapter is a certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation as listed under 11 N.N.C., part 1, Section 10; and
- 2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 1 (B), the Coppermine Chapter is delegated the governmental authority to make decisions over local matters consistent with Navajo Laws, customs, and tradition; and

On May 7, 2018 the Navajo Nation Council approved Resolution CAP-35-18 Relating to Health Education and Human Services, Resources and Development, Budget and Finance and NAAKIK'IYATI Committees and the Navajo Nation Council; Adopted the Sihasin Fund Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan Pursuant to CD-68-14 as amended; and
- 4. The Division of Community Development has been assigned to coordinate with chapters to review their Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP) to identify their construction ready projects for the Sihasin financing initiatives to provide an updated listing for the oversight committee; and
- 5. The Navajo-Hopi Land Commission shall exercise its authorities as authorized by 2 NNC Section 851 et. seq. and P.L. 100-666 (as amended) which includes approving the criteria for the selection of applicants that may be funded under the Navajo Rehabilitation Trust Fund; and
- 6. Indian Health Service initial plans to deliver water to the Koko Extension by extending a pipeline from Kaibeto will be costly, and because IHS prioritizes projects based on the cost per household to deliver water, the Koko extension could be years away from implementation. Using the a new well and storage tank in the Koko area significantly reduces IHS costs per household of delivering water to this area, and could enable IHS to advance the priority of all phases of the Koko extension—meaning that more unserved residents in the former Bennett Freeze area can get water sooner; and
- 7. Coppermine Chapter has made an assessment to identified individual homes for repairs or replacement and to estimate the cost to repair the existing structure or construct a new house identifying the individual homes and specific actions to make them habitable. This list has been reviewed by the Former Bennett Freeze Area Planning Group and reviewed by the Coppermine Chapter Planning Committee and the Community Land Use Planning Committee and Chapter members as it approaches implementation, see Exhibit A & B; and
