a. Resolution # CO-07-050-19: A Supporting Resolution, Which Shows Support of the Navajo Coppermine and Chapter and Its Representative Community of Dartmouth College Undergraduate Student, Hailee Brown, Mellon Mays Undergraduate Fellowship Senior Research Concerning the Coal Mining Industry/Navajo Generating Station (NGS) and Experiences of the Navajo Community Members As Required to Receive Necessary Approval of the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department (NNHPD) and Dartmouth College Institutional Review Board (IRB) – Roberta Brown

b. Navajo Tribal Utility Authority_— Water Department. Daryl Shorty — we cover the water project for NTUA for western agency. Office of Environmental Health obtains funds for the waterline projects. Navajo Engineering Construction Authority (NECA) does the construction for the waterline project. After the project is completed then is given to NTUA for maintenance and repair. Safe Drinking Water Act educating the community. Waste water. NEPA inspects the waste water and its coming up for western agency.

Floyd – water that goes into homes. There is water stand just outside which testing is needed since people utilize that water for personal use.

Daryl – there is backfill program. Garden hose is contaminated easily. Its chapter responsibility to test for the water stand. There should be a backfill prevention for the water stand.

Wilford – need to have better projects listing. After completed the 4 projects then can revisit the projects. Got call from Council Delegates then wanted projects so gave the waterline project information. The projects will be updated into the WIND system.

- I. Community Cemetery Linda Long we need to have a community cemetery. Was told that the CLUP Manual will not be certified if there is no community cemetery in the CLUP manual.

Brian - how many acres for cemetery

Linda - 10 acres

Floyd – Antelope Trail there is cemetery which is considered but residents in that area aren't aware of making into community cemetery. Law is new that you cannot bury anywhere you want. Use to say will bury person where the person herd sheep. Was told to mortuary to only bury person in cemetery. Need to survey and archeological clearances for the cemetery site. Calvin stated 54 burial site in Coppermine which was GPS and stated on a map. Need to have central location for burial site. Antelope Trail Cemetery need to have the residents come together to agree on this location.

Brian - cemetery for south

Floyd - there was location mention for south

Sid – for the family burial plot that aren't prepared will be charged a fine. My family and relation in our region are working on family burial plot.

Floyd - If its okay for residents for the Antelope Cemetery is July 23 at 6pm

m. Resolution # CO-07-055-19: Coppermine is requesting for funds for the Coppermine Former Bennett Freeze Area for Home Renovation and Bathroom Addition in the amount of \$340,000 (34 homes x \$10,000) and hire Senior Carpenters and Carpenters for the Project of the 34 homes in the amount of \$100,000 for an overall Total Fund Request of \$440,000.

Sid – resolution for the \$100,000 for the Man Power use for the FBFA area for home renovation project.

Paul – NHLC is coming on July 27, 2019 to Coppermine. There are NHLC for Coppermine FBFA. any request for the FBFA put into chapter resolution. If you are requesting through verbal doesn't count only through resolution. Resolution pushes requests.

Floyd - recommend to put the item on the agenda since its not on the agenda.

Floyd – amend resolution to request for additional funds

Lola - need housing assessment for the homes which was suppose to be done by CHID

Natalie - homes need to be re-assessed

Lola -

Floyd – cost for materials is \$6000 but other budgeted at \$10,000 and labor

Wilford – keep the resolution separate from \$100,000. These additional funds request need to keep resolution separate from existing funds. I have already done some home assessments and can prepare the material listings. Lola – this is so important because of the water. there is going to be well east of windmill which will be taking to Gap Water Tank then taken to Bitter Springs then Cameron. We need to get ready so we can use the water wthin Coppermine and the need for bathroom addition. We need to take care of this asap.

Floyd – need to amend resolution to use the \$100,000 for the labor.

Sid – request for additional funds which Wilford and Chapter staff will work on it.

54 homes of which 20 home are on the current Renovation Project and need funds for 34 homes.

34 homes x \$10,000 = \$340,000 for Renovation and Bathroom Project

Need for additional Labor for the 34 homes of \$100,000

Overall Total = \$440,000

Sid – Aug 26 is the last train run for NGS. Nov 8 shutdown of plant. Nov 9 start work for contractors. Need for 4 contractors.

Regina – got call at 930am of horse display on pole that had died. I have pictures which you see if want. Lola - I have seen 100 horses at first windmill. Road N21 which will do road improvement then will move to Chapter Spur Road for road work. Lille McCabe will be represented TCRHCC Board of Directors. The Bodaway Gap Clinic will be having meeting at Coppermine on Thursday at 10am and educate on phase I. CLUP Manual is still in the working process and will be forward to Resource Committee in August so need to have a public hearing to the community soon.

Valerie – Road N21 has shortfall of \$250,000 for purchasing and transporting 4500 ton sand from grey mountain to Coppermine. To add to lola's report.

- d. Council Delegate provide update. 3rd meeting today. Task force. NABI is meeting is needing our votes. He didn't approved their travel. This legislation need vote to make it the summer session. Seth Damon spoke with on project that's not in construction but needs to be ready regarding the waterline project. Water Treatment Plant at NGS location. Funds can be used to built new one. Sihasin Funds the number one issue is no water. I have made that a priority project. \$29 million is need for the project. Can request \$20 million from Sihasin Funds and remaining \$9 million request from Navajo Parks Recreation. Herman Daniels are taking action to Navajo Parks Recreation which have income revenue but where does the funds go and not the chapter. 25% of the Revenue which Grand Canyon Gorge 25% of the income revenue goes to chapter. Need to have 25% of the revenue of Navajo Parks Recreation go to the local chapter. If you are council delegate will not be holding another job. Been council delegate should be full time job since some are commissioners. HHEC meets on Monday and gets done by 3pm and now their meeting is on Thursday for LeChee Chapter. Wednesday sometimes hold a special meeting. Move HHEC meeting from Monday to Wednesday. 2 terms service for council delegates, presidential, vice presidential will be discussed. Headstart has many issues and owe a lot of funds. there is legislation to pay for headstart's past debt. The debts

which dates back to 2003 for total of \$6,333,000 this is going to major discussion. Robert Black, NHLC is coming to Coppermine along with Mr. Shebala and Pearl Yellowman. Law and Order committee which discussed security for police officers and met with BIA which look into the budget for unspent funds that was reverted back. Issue with 911. Of the incident of toddlers past away. Heated discussion on 911 and toddler incident. Police chief of the Navajo Nation left his badge on the table and left the building and said you all take care of it. Delmar went after Police Chief then came back in and pickup his badge. I am on 9 committees.

Comment: use the funds set aside by Peterson Zah to pay for the Headstart bill.
