There is a lot of work that needs to be completed. We have received assistance from Workforce with younger people that have computer knowledge. Vandine also assisted the chapter but left for higher paying job. Then Roylentia was hired for the Assessment and need to continue her Employment to finish the Assessment for Coppermine Community.
