RESOLUTION OF THE COPPERMINE CHAPTER

REAFFIRMING RESOLUTION CO-04-07-07 WHICH WITHDRAEW 75 ACRES TRACT OF LAND FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW HEALTH CENTER, STAFF QUARTERS, EASEMENTS AND SEWER LAGOON AND RELATED FACILITIES ONE MILE NORTH OF GAP PRIMARY SCHOOL ON NAVAJO ROUTE 20 (NR20) TO PROVIDE HEALTH-RELATED SERVICES TO LOCAL COMMUNITIES.

WHEREAS:

1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., section 3, and 11 N.N.C., section 10, the Coppermine Chapter is a duly recognized and certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government; and
2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Chapter 1: Navajo Nation Chapter, Section 1., (B) (1) & (20, the Navajo Nation Council delegated to Chapter governmental authority with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo law, including custom and tradition and allows chapter to make decisions to govern with responsibility and accountability to community membership and
3. The Coppermine Chapter supported and approved Resolution CO-04-070-07 dated April 15, 2007, for the withdrawal of 75 acres' tract of land for the construction of a new health center north of Gap Primary School; and
4. The Coppermine Chapter acknowledged four (4) potential sites that were evaluated by Indian Health Service and community members in 2005. The primary site recommended north of Gap Primary School on NR-20 was determined to be most feasible that is easily accessible to nearby infrastructure (utilities, water, electricity and roads) for the New Health Facility; and
5. The Coppermine Chapter still supports the proposal and acknowledges all favorable changes, and plans, and updates that have been made since the initial commitment to and hereby reaffirmed.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Coppermine Chapter, hereby reaffirms its support of Resolution CO-04-070-07 that withdrew 75 acres' tract of land for the construction of a new health center staff, quarters, easements and sewer lagoon and related facilities on mile north of Gap Primary School on NR-20 To provide health-related services to local communities.
