PEOPLE IN COPPERMINE, LECHEE, KAIBETO, NAVAJO MOUNTAIN, OLJATO, GAP
BODAWAY, AND OTHER WESTERN NAVAJO CHAPTERS ADJACENT TO GRAND CANYON
NATIONAL PARK, GLEN CANYON NATIONAL RECREATION AREA AND RAINBOW BRIDGE
NATIONAL MONUMENTS INCLUDING LANDS ALONG AND WITHIN THE SOUTH SHORLINES
OF THE COLORADO RIVER AND LAKE POWELL

WHEREAS:

1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 2, and 11 N.N.C., Section 10, The Coppermine Chapter is a duly recognized and certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government; and

2. Pursuant to N.N.C., Chapter 1: Navajo Nation Chapter, Section 1., (B) (1) & (2), The Navajo Nation Council Delegated to Chapter Governmental authority with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo Law, including custom and tradition and allows chapter to make decisions to govern with responsibility and accountability to community membership; and

3. The Navajo families and their leadership within these lands that border these areas managed by the Federal and Navajo Nation governments were not properly involved in the planning and establishment of these Navajo Nation and National Park and Recreation area. The establishment of the Little Colorado River Gorge, Marble Canyon and Lake Powell Tribal Parks came into being without chapter recommendations for approval including the Congressional or Presidential Proclamations Act, Glen Canyon National Park, The Grand Canyon National Enlargement Act, Glen Canyon National Recreation Area nor Rainbow Bridge National Monument.

4. As a consequence of the taking these natural and cultural resources by the Federal and Navajo Nation government, local Navajo families have been improperly served by government by being adequately involved in past land transactions nor compensated for these areas, and:

5. The 1970Quad insured the Navajo economic opportunities would be protected as required by the language within this agreement. The APDCP & EA emphasized the Navajo Nation preference in economic development within south shores of Lake Powell. Furthermore, the Navajo Nation has jurisdiction as noted in the agreement from the surface of the water south including he joint jurisdiction with the NPS to the water elevation 3720. Let it be known the water elevation 3720 is higher than the top of the dam:

6. The National Park Service recently issued a concession to a non-Navajo company to conduct rive trios on the Colorado River at Lee's Ferry without proper planning and agreement by the Navajo Nation especially the local Navajo families;

7. The National Park Service failed to recognize a Navajo Nation authorized company who had obtained a permit to do river trips since The Navajo Nation owns river and lands beginning at midstream an don the south shorelines of the Colorado River within Glen Canyon National recreation Area;

8. In addition, the NPS and FAA are currently proposing the approval a Air Tour Management Plan to be under the jurisdiction of the NPS and FAA without proper recognition and Navajo Nation management in the long term policy especially with regard to the local District One Chapters. District One Chapters include Coppermine, LeChee, and other chapters including Navajo Mountain, Gap Bodaway and Oljato;

Finally, since the 1970Quad is expiring in 2020, the Navajo Nation needs to determine how to protect the future of the Navajo People and their economic and natural resource opportunities to manage, protect and develop

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT;

1. The Coppermine Chapter hereby approves and support the Navajo Nation Executive and Legislative Branches to establish a Navajo Nation team to address the planning, management and development issues within the shorelines of the Colorado River and Lake Powell in order protect the sovereignty and economic development

2. The Coppermine Chapter recommend the Navajo Nation Team through community based planning approach develop Navajo Nation policies and regulations that allow for economic development while protecting and

managing natural resource;

3. The Coppermine Chapter recommend the plans be executed with any and all Federal, State and Navajo entities.
