V. Old Business:

 Ulaleya Blake-Keetso [I.H.S Environmental Health] – update on water proc NW89 is ROW phase, new engineer in the office so gave him project but only employed for 6 months so projects is back with me.

South NW89 (3-4 homes, Lee Clizzie) – grazing permit needed

Koko Extension – arch cleared, land survey received information, design going

Koko Ext Phase 2 – arch survey scheduled, land survey scheduled,

Planning Project Phase 3 Koko – gave fund for planning and no schedule for arch yet

Coppermine cistern – received funds and scattered project

Hoping to get more engineers hired.

Handling 70 projects, signed 4 year project to stay in Tuba City

When do you except for first project to start?

Ulaleya: Lee Clizzie is been push and using IJA funds and also the cistern plus the koko extension.

Ulaleya: We have new engineer and is still learning.

How do you prioritize the projects and how are they fund?

Ulaleya: Tuba city started handing out project to outside companies when low staff.

What is timeline for NW waterline?

Ulaleya: Everything done, started design, getting road crossing permit from ADOT is taking time, have to documents form NECA to provide to ADOT, ADOT permit will hold up the ROW,

Is cost in place for NW waterline, bump it up for waterline due to cost?

Ulaleya: Received covid funds and were ask if we needed more funds, and have ask for additional funds for the project cost for all projects for inflation.

Lela: Waterline through Coppermine to Gap, you refer to putting water into the homes, we met with state dept water rights, were surprised no water in the homes, sad for the elders,

Wilford: bathroom addition still responsibility of the chapter

Ulaleya: yes, tribe is working with NECA, also they are working with water connection for people living close the waterline as well

Lola: we been very concerned for water situation, we know there is water for southern end of Coppermine but we the last one to be served, water is taking to gap and Cameron, we wondered why our community wasn't first on the list, what is the arpa fund received

Ulaleya: water pressure is the issue, kaibeto water to come to Coppermine, request for new tank, cooley is working on the tank,

Lola: water is coming from kaibeto

Ulaleya: water coming on kaibeto, going to be testing the water pressure,

Deborah: when addressing fbfa

Ulaleya: I don't have boundary on map, heard of the fbfa later, we are serving all families, starting in April, we work on new projects, received call from Coppermine resident that lives close to waterline to request for water so working on adding him,

Deborah: we created task force, priority list on who needs water,

Ulaleya: have homes located on google map,

Comment – announce on ktnn that people can submit application for water needs

Ulaleya: not sure if chapter has facebook to announce that

Kee - if you want update on the application,

Ulaleya – you can come to my office to update your application

Kee - I need bathroom addition and not sure where it at chapter

Comment – in 2009, we move to reservation, request for bathroom addition with handicap, but was skipped, so what happen to our application,

Ulaleya – we don't do bathroom addition

Comment – who do I speak to about bathroom addition.

Ulaleya – not sure who but talk to Navajo Nation

Esther – spoke to lane before he left the office and was told no more funding

Lola – not sure if easier for you to have date for the water situation so community can come to the chapter house for their water needs

Wilford – heard you wrong on bathroom addition

Ulaleya – we don't do bathroom addition. The navajo nation have funds and funds given to NECA to do the bathroom addition.

Wilford – provide update on western pipeline from page

Ulaleya – will schedule date to out to Coppermine for water application.

Joann — introduce herself to the community. Thank you to the students. Jessie Thompson did the resolution. Jessie is board of director for ADOT and only Navajo on the board. Lechee chapter approved the resolution and its required to have 2 chapters to approve the resolution to be added to the western agency council meeting. Study for rural school bus route in Northeastern Arizona. Highway 89, highway 98, to study the bus route, to study missing schools on bus route. This resolution is a supporting so they can do the study of why missing schools by the students. Governor has to appoint him. winter session. Deborah — student misses one school then school misses money.

Chris – road N20 there is no bus turn out. There is no bus turn off for gravel turn off. Can you assist with that for the bus route.

Joann – we have met with NDOT and BIA which they blame each other. Saying it so and so responsibility. Have went to legislation and brought up concern on the road for N20 as well. Who is the enforcement on the road and mention to ADOT director. We need to keep the semi-truck off of N20 and they should utilize 89.

Lena F – coconino supervisor – driving app for driving from flagstaff and page which google direct people to drive through N20 and need to direct people to highway 89.

Comment – I got my CDL and drive the school bus and its not only tourist that speed but also local residents speed on N20 and pass the buses many times. I have ask chapter to grade the road and they grade less.

We have tried to request to grade the road. Rear engine bus. Need to start parking the bus at the chapter and need to have gate key then I'll park and pickup the bus and will close/open gate.

Lena – we don't have gravel but chapter say no for local gravel on reservation but chapter says no. so we end up purchasing gravel from flagstaff. The sales tax is not collected on the Navajo Nation.

Chris – leonard Tsosie said its up to the chapter, page steel use the road and ruining the road, so have resolution to start fine them companies.

Cynthia – we have no gravel pit. Navajo nation bought gravel pit 20,000 by Indian wells. Can we use that. Allen – it's the location. Local gravel pit.

Allen - back to the resolution.

Comment – how is the study conducts Joann – by strips

5. **Resolution CO-01-015-24**: [Budget Revision Emergency Funds]: Budget Transfer from within the Chapter Fund Account 17 – Emergency Fund to transfer fund 6202 (travel expense) of \$531.25; from 6351 (grain purchase) of \$1520.00; from 6352 (food purchase) of \$1000.00; from 6353 (wood purchase) of \$1000.00 to be all transferred into 6354 (propane purchase) for total amount of \$4081.25 to replenish the account to purchase propane for Coppermine community during Emergency.

Lola – this is emergency fund. Do we use all the funds or keep some funds in the account for emergency.

Deborah - if we don't use the funds then what happens to the account

Allen – money is only use when NN President declare Emergency. Reason we didn't use it last time is that chapter receive the funds late.

Comment - will the funds be move else where

Allen – no it cannot be used else where, just what is budgeted

Chris – is the propane for the chapter or the people

Allen – its for the people, person takes the propane to the page to get tank filled

Chris – funds need to pay for the operator to address the road,

Cynthia – so president declared emergency. Allen – yes.

Deborah - how would you handle the firewood,

Allen – purchase firewood from resident, full bed

Comment – people in rural area, shooting years back, how are people to be informed in case of emergency, like the trading post fire, like an alarm

Allen - that's hard for rural area, people tell each other and call each other,

Comment – trading post burning down, is there investigation,

Allen – trading post is not on Coppermine but lease

Comment – is funds collecting interest. Allen – no.

Comment – what is in the food, we don't get food, who gets food,

Comment – wood is it for chapter to purchase wood or what

Allen – quarter bed is \$250 and shorter bed is \$200 to purchase from local vendor

Comment – your buying wood from resident

Comment – are you buying from registered voters. Allen – yes.

Comment – its distribute to elders and need

Stanford – if you all agree to put \$11,000 into propane or elsewhere

Comment – keep funds and not do the transfer

Comment – food is given out, need to think about our elders whom need the food, propane and wood, help the elders first and not the younger ones, some elders don't have people living in the home,

Comment – approve the budget transfer as is and can make adjustment later on

Comment – we have handicap at home, I usually call or they send letter, I called, I need to make 2 appts for the same day, said it can not be done, told them im on fixed income, I have to take my son to varies appts to phoenix, st George, etc. I purchase second insurance. I take my son to lechee recently and told to get another provider, change is needed at TCRHCC

Lela – need those comments of changes needed

Comment – customer service needs to be step up, hiring, people apply and get denied or over qualified, Lena – board make the decisions, get funds, etc. to move wall with I.H.S. need to get approval from above. Navajo nation police is 638 so it social services.

Coconino County said no to trucking. Navajo Nation said no to trucking through Navajo nation. They took out a permit in 1872 so they can mine uranium. Schedule meeting on Monday to let Navajo nation president know. The grand canyon which biden said to protect the canyon. Any new permit is a No. forest service. Rare metal have uranium tailings. Lousie yellowman and other people we have worked with. They covered the uranium mine tailings. People moved out of their homes and is fenced off. Jill biden help the Navajo nation and the 1872. Ute live by blanding and there is company that works with uranium.
