REAFFIRMING, AUTHORIZING AND SUPPORTING THE COPPERMINE CHAPTER AND THE DISTRICT 1 (ONE) GRAZING COMMITTEE MEMBER TO IMPLEMENT AN INDEFINITE FERAL HORSE, STRAY AND UNCLAIMED LIVESTOCK REMOVAL PROGRAM IN EFFORTS TO IMPROVE THE ECOLOGICAL HEALTH AND PRODUCTIVITY OF THE NAVAJO RANGELANDS FOR PRESENT AND FUTURE GENERATIONS OF THE NAVAJO PEOPLE.

WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3, and 11 N.N.C., Section 10 the Coppermine Chapter is a duly recognized and certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government; and
- 2. Navajo Nation Council Resolution #CAP-34-98 codifies 26 Navajo Nation code, the Local Government Act, which authorized chapters to implement community-based projects beneficial to the community members; and
- 3. The Navajo Nation Department of Fish and Wildlife have identified 38,000 horses through an official survey; and
- 4. Bureau of Indian Affairs / Branch of Natural Resource vegetation studies reveal the land cannot sustain the current permitted number of livestock thus further impacting the range conditions; and
- 5. The excess population of feral horses and stray livestock are causing deterioration and depletion of resources on the Navajo Nation grazing lands, which includes, wildlife ecological damage, water sources, rangelands, and sacred sites, at a rapid speed; and
- 6. The excess population of stray and feral horses and livestock are over utilizing the range, and causing negative economic impacts on ranchers, farmers, and residents; and
- 7. Inadequate availability of rangeland forage cause livestock to seek forage within highway Right-of-ways creating a dangerous driving environment resulting in injury, death and property damage; and
- 8. Free roaming stallions, bulls and other livestock create a public safety issue for children, elderly and individuals enjoying the outdoor environment; and
- 9. To encourage volunteer livestock removal for Navajo families with limited resources to market their livestock; and
- 10. The Coppermine Chapter recognizes there are livestock producers who are willfully in livestock trespass; and
- 11. The Coppermine Chapter aspires to honor and comply with all Navajo Nation Grazing Regulations and supports Navajo Ranchers and Producers, in attempts to provide an opportunity for economic reciprocity; and
- 12. The Navajo Nation code, Title 3, Chapter 7, Subsection 1311, Livestock or Equine Roundup Procedures and Requirements sets forth legal regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Coppermine Chapter authorizing the Grazing Official, The Department of Agriculture, The Department of Resource Enforcement, The Department of Fish and Wildlife and The Bureau of Indian Affairs, Branch of Natural Resources, to assist with all livestock removal activities.
- 2. The Coppermine Chapter encourages humane methods of entrapment to Utilized throughout the livestock removal program.
- 3. Right-of-way will be continuously patrolled for livestock in trespass.

4. The Department of Agriculture, The Department of Resource Enforcement shall plan and coordinate voluntary livestock sales.

5. The Navajo Nation shall comply with 3 NNC, Chapter 7, subsection 1311.

- 6. The Navajo Nation shall assist transportation for individuals in need of resource to market their livestock upon availability of resources.
- 7. The implementation of the feral, stray and unclaimed livestock removal program shall in indefinite.

SUPPORTING LOCAL RESIDENTS AND TRADITIONAL LAND USERS OF BLACK MESA OPPOSING THE PROPOSAL, FUNDING, AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE NORTH, EAST, AND SOUTH BLACK MESA PUMPED STORAGE PROJECTS

WHEREAS:

- The Coppermine Chapter is a recognized chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, pursuant to Navajo National Council Resolution CAP-34-98, known as the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act and herein codifies in Title Twenty-six (26) of the Navajo Nation Code; and
- 2. The Twenty-six (26) of the Navajo Nation Code allows Coppermine Chapter to make decisions over local matters; and
- 3. The Coppermine Chapter supports traditional land use on Black Mesa consistent with the health of land, people, non-human relatives, and Nahasdzaáan dóó Yádilhil Bitsąądęę Beehaz 'aanii-Diné Natural Law (1 N.N.C.§ 205); and
- 4. The Coppermine Chapter recognizes that decades of coal mining has damaged the health and productivity of Black Mesa's land, groundwater, and springs that people and non-human relatives depend on; and
- 5. The Coppermine Chapter recognizes that restoring Black Mesa's land to pre-mining conditions is a top priority, and opposes further industrial use of the Navajo Nation water, including groundwater beneath Black Mesa; and
- 6. The Coppermine Chapter understands, acknowledges, and recognizes that the proposed Black Mesa North, East, and South Pumped Storage Projects, if built, would construct new reservoirs, pipeline, power lines, and other energy infrastructure atop Black Mesa; and
- 7. The Coppermine Chapter understands, acknowledges, and recognizes that the proposed Black Mesa North, East, and South Pumped Storage Projects, if built, would require 450,000 acre-feet of water to begin operations and would require additional water to continue operations for 100 years; and
- 8. The Coppermine Chapter understands, acknowledges, and recognizes that water required for the proposed Black Mesa North, East, and South Pumped Storage Projects would come for the San Juan River, the Colorado River, or Black Mesa groundwater; and
- 9. The Coppermine Chapter understands, acknowledges, and recognizes that the proposed Black Mesa North, East, and South Pumped Storage Projects, if built, would destroy land and displace traditional land uses on Black Mesa inconsistent with the health of land, people, non-human relatives, and Nahasdzáán dóó Yadilhil Bitsąądęę Beehaz'áanii- Diné Natural Law (1 N.N.C. § 205); and
- 10. The Coppermine Chapter understands, acknowledges, and recognizes that the proposed Black Mesa North, East, and South Pumped Storage Projects, if built, would, like coal mining, use Black Mesa's land and water to create and export electricity and profits to far away cities; and
- 11. The Coppermine Chapter understands, acknowledges, and recognizes that preliminary permit applications for the Black Mesa North East, and South Pumped Projects were filed with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission without consulting with or consent from the Black Mesa region Chapters, residents, and local land users; and

NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED THAT:

 The Coppermine Chapter opposes the proposal, funding, and development of the Black Mesa North, East, and South Projects and requesting Navajo Nation President Buu Nygren and the 25th Navajo Nation Council to oppose the preliminary permit applications for the Black Mesa Pump Storage Project filed with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.
