RESOLUTION OF THE COPPERMINE CHAPTER

Supporting Resolution of Coppermine Chapter for the Navajo Nation Council Health Human Education Service Committee's Proposed Resolution to accept the United States (US) President Joseph Biden's nomination Of Navajo Tribal member, Roselyn Tso as Director of the Indian Health Service Department (I.H.S.) of Health and Human Services (HHS).

WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C. § 3(A), the Coppermine Chapter is a certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, as listed at 11 N.N.C. § 10, as amended, which has also been certified pursuant to the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act, 26 N.N.C. §§ 1 et seq., as amended, and possesses the authority and responsibility to promote local projects that benefit the local community and its economic development: and
- 2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C.§ 1(B), the Coppermine Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and make appropriate recommendations to the Navajo Nation, Federal, State, and Local Agencies for appropriate actions, and is also empowered by the Navajo Nation Council to review all matters affecting the local community and to make favorable in the best interests of the community to protect and promote the general health, safety, and welfare of the Chapter's Membership and all Navajos.
- 3. Coppermine Chapter is requesting for the Navajo Nation Council to accept Roselyn Tso's nomination as the Director of the Indian Health Service. If Roselyn Tso is confirmed by the United States Senate, she will oversee Health Care for 2.5 million tribal members and Alaska Natives in 37 states with more than 600 hospitals, clinics, and health stations. The Indian Health Service has an annual budget of approximately \$7.5 billion dollars.
- 4. Roselyn Tso began her career with I.H.S. in 1984. She previously served in various roles in the Portland Area. In 2005, Ms. Tso assumed the role of the Director, Office of Tribal and Service Unit Operations for the Portland Area, in her leadership she was responsible for the implementation of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Act and worked directly with tribes. Ms. Tso also worked with three urban programs in the Portland Area that provide services ranging from community health to comprehensive primary health care services. She holds a Bachelor of Arts in interdisciplinary studies and a master's degree in Organizational management from Marylhurst University in Portland, Oregon.
- 5. Therefore, Coppermine Chapter is supporting her nomination from the U.S. President, Joseph R. Biden Jr. Under her leadership and expertise, she has helped save lives on the Navajo Nation during the Covid-19 pandemic. The National Congress of American Indian support the nomination for I.H.S. Director position which has been vacant for more than a year.

NOW THERFORE BE IT RESOVED:

Coppermine Chapter supports Proposed Resolution for Navajo Nation Council to accept Roselyn Tso's nomination as the Director of Indian Health Service.

WHEREAS:

- 1. Chapter Authorities
- 2. Our chapter community is overrun by roaming dogs; these dogs are uncared for; they continually search for food; these dogs are in poor health and carry parasites; puppies are abandoned within our communities; and
- 3. We would like for our chapter community members to be able to enjoy the outdoors; to run, to play, to hike, to walk without the threat of being bitten or attacked by dogs; our children do not need to carry sticks to ward off dogs to play outside; and
- 4. The Coppermine Chapter does not want any of our residents to be a victim of a mauling case due to aggressive, vicious or packing dogs; we want our community to be safe; and
- 5. Our community members have difficulty finding veterinary services to get pets to have a spay or neuter surgery; it takes months to get an appointment; the great expense of a spay or neuter is cost prohibitive to our chapter residents.

NOW, THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Coppermine Chapter Hereby Supports and Recommends Approval of the Navajo Nation Council proposed legislation #005-22 to award \$267,184 to Animal Rez-Q Inc. to conduct 4,000 free spay, neuter, vaccination and microchipping of Navajo pets for individuals living on the Navajo Nation to address and mitigate the overpopulation of unwanted animals.
