RESOLUTION OF THE COPPERMINE CHAPTER

SUPPORTING AND RECOMMENDING TUBA CITY REGIONAL HEALTH CARE CORPORATION (TCRHCC) TO COMPACT WITH THE INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE (I.H.S.) FOR THE PLANNING, DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF BODAWAY GAP/ECHO CLIFFS HEALTH CENTER PURSUANT TO PUBLIC LAW 93-638, AS AMENDED, AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL (NNC) RESOLUTION CJY 33-10

WHEREAS:

- 1. The Bodaway Gap/Echo Cliffs Health Center (BGECHC) is currently budgeted at \$151.2 million and it is anticipated that the I.H.S. will notify the Navajo Nation and the TCRHCC) of the availability of funding for the BGECHC in Spring 2022, and will request the Navajo Nation and the TCRHCC to respond within 30 days as to whether they wish to proceed with the design and construction of the BGECHC by direct I.H.S. design and construction, or by a Title V Compact carried out by the TCRHCC; and
- 2. The Navajo Nation Council through Resolution No. CJY-33-10 (July 21,2010) and Naabik'iyati Committee Resolution NABID 96-18 (December 27, 2018) authorized TCRHCC and other Title V tribal organizations to "design and construct projects within each tribal organizations' service area", and BGECHC is within TCRHCC's service area; and
- 3. It has been the Nation's policy and trend to empower and encourage local governance at various levels of governmental operations including schools, health care institutions, chapters and others who are delegated increased oversight and autonomy over local programs and institutions.

NOW, THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED THAT:

The Coppermine Chapter:

- 1. Supports and recommends that the Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation compact with the Indian Health Service for the planning, design and construction of the Bodaway Gap/Echo Cliffs Health Service as authorized by P.L. 93-638 and Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJY-33-10.
- 2. Request and recommends that TCRHCC be fully supported by the Navajo Nation President and Vice President, the Speaker of The Navajo Nation Council, the Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, and the Navajo Nation Council on this long anticipated health care expansion.
- 3. Requests the Indian Health Service, Navajo Area Indian Health Service, Navajo Area Indian Health Service and the Navajo Department of Health to provide support and guidance during the negotiations of funding, and other necessary agreements, in the securing of a Compact Project Funding Agreement by and between TCRHCC and the Indian Health Service, for the planning, design and construction of the Bodaway Gap/Echo Cliffs Health Center project.
